As is the case with so many organizations, FOIM receives most of its annual donations in the final three months of the year; and it is with this in mind that I ask you to support us once again this year, and also to consider increasing your level of giving. To those of you who enjoy our newsletter and have supported us in the past, please consider a gift this year. I'm asking for your support so directly because I realize that each of you receives solicitations from many organizations and that, over the past several years, the economy has been difficult. Along with other organizations, Friends of the Ixchel Museum has seen its yearly donations decrease over the last four years, and this has limited our ability to support US based educational projects and special projects in Guatemala. We continue with our work as best we can, dedicated to our special role in promoting the unique heritage of Guatemalan weaving, and are thoughtful and selective about projects and activities we support.

In 2013, your donations funded five significant projects in Guatemala. We have refocused museum field research to document the current state of community festivals and *cofradias*, sending a three-person team--an anthropologist, a photographer and the museum registrar--to the field. In 2013, the team documented five different communities. Other projects focused on attracting more visitors to the museum and raising awareness of our programs. Finally, thanks to FOIM funding, Museo Ixchel joined the American Alliance of Museums (AAM) and our museum director, Maria Renée Aguilar, attended the AAM annual meeting in Baltimore.

In the US (and greater North America), we continue to support Guatemalan textile exhibitions, and the Guatemalan community residing in the US. Inside the newsletter, you'll find details on these activities, as well as about upcoming events.
